	Prior to the advent of Christianity, Africans believed in the spirit world populated by gods, the dead ancestors and the supreme God. For them, the spiritual beings made things happen but were not friends. The relationship between the traditional Africans and the gods was that of mutual respect ("Let human beings not work against the spirit and let the spirit not work against human beings). They have this unwritten norm in mind when making expensive sacrifices to their deity. Therefore, it seems they sacrificed not in faith but in fear, not in love but in justice.
